Saving Grace Farm ~ "Horse Club" Lesson Policies

- **Cost**: \$100/month (\$80/multi-child). Payment is due the last lesson of the previous month or by the 1st. Payments may be made online. Payments made after the 5th of the month will incur a \$5 late fee.
- Discontinuing Lessons: please let us know the month prior if you will discontinue services with Saving Grace Farm.
- Students should arrive 5 to 10 minutes prior to lessons to ensure they are ready and prepared to begin.
- Tardiness: Lessons will begin and end at their scheduled time, so being late cuts into your time in the lesson.
- Attire: We recommend pants and weather appropriate clothing. Sturdy, closed-toed shoes that stay on securely are REQUIRED. No crocs, sandals, flip flops, dress flats, etc. We have helmets available or you may purchase your own.
- **Absence**: No discounts will be given for absences. Occasional makeup times will be offered for the group when Saving Grace cancels due to weather or other issues.
- **Privacy**: Saving Grace also offers Therapeutic Programs to people with special needs and disabilities. Please respect the rights and privacy of these participants. If you overhear information about these participants or you observe their lessons, please do not share their names/information outside of our facility.
- Saving Grace Farm reserves the right to refuse service to, or ban from the property, etc. anyone who disrupts programming, does not follow farm rules, or acts unethically, illegally, or disrespectfully to ANYONE on the premises.
- Family and friends should not enter areas with horses and should wait in designated areas if staying onsite. Children should be supervised at all times unless under direct supervision of the instructor.
- Our Curriculum: In Horsemanship there is much more to learn about horses than just riding. A good Equestrian knows how to lead, feed, groom, bathe, give first aid, care for the equipment, etc. Groundwork teaches responsibility, empathy, respect, and other valuable information that is useful in horse ownership and in life. It also helps with empowering the student, managing a horse safely from the ground, earning the horse's respect, and teaching the student how to safely interact with the animal, etc. Ground lessons are a part of our curriculum here and will be given on the weeks between your student's designated ride times.

At Saving Grace Farm, we try to emulate mutual respect and trust, and we hope that you will see this, as you participate in the programs we have to offer here. Thank you for your participation in the programs at Saving Grace Farm.
